This Week in 3A

Math: This week, students will be continuing on with Module 3 of focusing on both multiplication and division principals. We will review the distributive property with larger numbers as well as word problems on Tuesday of this week. On Wednesday, students will be solving order of operations problems utilizing all four operations and parenthesis. On Thursday of this week, students will be solidifying their understanding of the associative property of multiplication as well as apply these concepts to multi step word problems.

Reading: This week in reading, students will be working on making inferences and working on really responding to literature through writing as well as making deeper inferences/analysis skills. This week into next week, students will be reading a variety of short fables to work on deeper inferencing skills in regards to mood, word choice, character development and more. In addition, students will be reading an extended fable entitled "The King's Equal." This is a short (65) page fable that allows few assessments to check for comprehension and understanding on their own.

Grammar/Writing: This week in writing, students will be officially finishing up their compare and contrast pieces regarding the mythical version versus the real story of Thanksgiving. Students will be completing this paragraph writing on Monday of this week. In conjunction with our fables in reading, students will actually well as choosing the central message in which we are basing our fable around.

We will continue on with our cursive writing and review of lowercase letter with uppercase letter beginning as we come back from our break! In addition, this week we will being our dialogue unit as we discuss how to punctuate all kinds of dialogue within our upcoming stories and comic strips we will be creating together.

Science: We will continue to engage with chapter 4 as we focus on animal and plant adaptations and creations. We will also be completing chapter 5 this week which focuses on season changes and animal adaptations and changes. Next week, we will be beginning our social studies unit on immigration.
