



# This Week in Third Grade...

Math: We just began our new Fraction Unit. This week, all students will be reviewing unit fractions, shaded and unshaded parts as well as fractions greater than one (improper fractions) and comparing fractions with like numerators and different denominators.

Reading: This week, We will be reading a drama entitled "Two Bear Cubs." This particular story is a Native American Folktale. In addition, we will be reading various nonfiction texts, small warm-up pieces and books in our guided reading groups.

\* As a special project I am conducting this month and next month, I am requiring students to take home a book about a well-known or less well-known Civil Rights leader. Most of the selections are picture books for children. However, there are a few more complex, longer selections as well. Each week, students will be required to read the book and write a reflection in their "Civil Rights Reflection Journal." The reflection journals last night were simply gorgeous. Students picked a new book on Friday, and their journal entry will be due

Writing/ Grammar: We began In writing, students will begin their Opinion Essays entitled "The Best Part of Me." We will spend much time talking about focus of our essay and providing excellent examples per each supporting reason. Students will revise their first paragraph and continue on to complete their second and third paragraphs as well as their conclusions. I love this piece particularly because we have really been focusing on positive qualities of ourselves. I think this has been a great exercise for all students. In grammar, we are reviewing pronouns, nouns, adjectives, adverbs an verbs as well as creating our very own book utilizing complex, compound and simple sentences. Sentence variety and structure is something we are working on quite heavily in class.

Read Aloud: We just completed our Read-Aloud entitled "The Rickshaw Girl." Students truly enjoyed this story and it certainly gave us great insight into the Bangladesh Way of Life. Students will be given all of their mini-quizzes and written responses from this unit on Monday! A lot of work was conducted during

Handwriting: We will be reviewing our lowercase letters this week through the connecting of two or three letters to make words. In addition, we will continue capital letters this week as part of our direct

Science: This week, students will be exploring the physics of sound, heat and motion! In the second half of the week we will be completing inquiry activities related to reflection as well as refraction!
