

This Week in Third Grade...

Math: This week in math, students will finish their fraction test on Monday. In addition, we will be taking a small probability unit will focus on generating pictographs as well as creating scaled bar graphs. In addition, we will introduce measurement as well.

Reading: Last week, students did an awesome job learning about point of view and author's purpose! We completed many creative activities taking another person's perspective such as a dog or a cat. In addition, we completed many "power-up" excerpt from a well known novel entitled "Sarah Plain and Tall." We will continue to complete small power sessions reviewing related to historical fiction.

March 12th-16th Writing/ Grammar: Students are currently working on illustrating their pieces "If you give _____ a _____." Truly, students did a lovely job learning how to construct a variety of compound, simple and complex sentences while creating a unique, creative writing experience for their reader. Students will eventually take home their final copy to share with you! The stories are magnificent. We are writing a letter to the original author as well as our stories to share with her.



Read Aloud: We are just now going to be beginning our very first "independent novel study" where students will work on discussing the characters, theme and overall plot development of a book entitled "Extra Credit" written by Andrew Clements. We have had multiple discussions and a few comprehension quizzes as well as partner activities involving this book. Students are really loving this novel and it certainly shows! This week, students will be assigned a penpal from Mrs. Amoscato's classroom (my mom) as the two characters in this book begin writing back and forth, they will be able to do so as well!

Handwriting: We will be reviewing our lowercase letters this week through the connecting of two or three letters to make test in cursive. Students did a really lovely job (even though it was tough!)

Social Studies: We began our social studies unit last week focusing on diversity and how certain members of the community have changed the world. We are learning about three other important human beings this week focusing on different cultures, diversity and changing of the community. Students worked quite well together on their google slides! They did a fabulous job writing together and adding design elements to their slides!
