This Week in Third Grade...





October 30-November 3rd

Math: Students did a really nice job reviewing money, learning how to make change and learning to interpret word problems! This week, we will be heading into the metric system. Students will be balancing kilograms and grams, estimating and solving word problems related to measurement. Later on this week, we will learn about milliliters and liters, balance equations and learn to solve problems.

Reading: This week, we will be completing our third lesson in the Unit 2 Reading series. We will be focusing on characters, plot and theme. Students will engage with an assortment of PIXAR animation clips to discover theme as well as folktales to compare and contrast themes from different works. The

We are beginning a classic novel entitled "The Hundred Dresses." This Novel will be taught during the afternoons and focuses on Diversity/Appreciating what you have! This week, we will focus on journaling chapters 5 and 6. Students will work on theme, character, setting and character motivations behind actions. Full group, independent and partner work activities will ensue.

Writing: We will be completing our final draft on our "Creative Halloween Writing Narrative Stories" tomorrow. Students will focus on varying sentence beginnings and adding description to their plot to heighten the suspense. We will be concluding our narrative writing unit with a final piece entitled "My Scariest Moment." This will be a shorter piece with a clear lead, beginning, middle and end.

Grammar: This week, we will be concluding and reviewing (abstract, concrete, singular and plural, common and proper, possessive) nouns as well as simple and compound sentences and types of sentences. Students will be identifying nouns through literature. In addition, we will be focusing on creating a "FALL STEW" activity understanding the difference between literal and nonliteral language and nouns.

Handwriting: We will be focusing on reviewing letters t, s, i, u, l, f, r, c, e, n, m, and focusing on

Social Studies: We are finally heading into our first social studies unit which focuses on understanding geography (continents and oceans) as well as understanding where we live in relationship to the world. We will be discussing William Penn and the birth of Pennsylvania as well as Pennsylvania
