

This Week in Third Grade...



Math: Last week we talked very specifically about pounds and ounces/kilograms and grams (measurements of weight.) This week, we will continue our talk regarding milliliters and liters. Students will be engaging in estimation and word problems of all four measurements. In addition, towards the end of the week, students will begin a review of rounding to the nearest 10 and 100.

Reading: This week, we will be completing our fourth lesson in the Unit 2 Reading series. We will be focusing on characters, plot and theme. However, we will also be focusing very specifically on cause and effect through our main piece of literature as well as small -group articles and literature. The main text focuses closely on Japanese Culture and art.

We will be close to completing our very first class novel entitled "The Hundred Dresses." This Novel will be taught during the afternoons and focuses on Diversity/Appreciating what you have! This week, we will focus on journaling chapters 6 and 7. Students will work on theme, character, setting and character motivations behind actions. Full group, independent and partner work activities will ensue.

Writing/ Grammar: We will continue to share out our "Spooky Stories." During shared writing. However, writing this week will be combined with our grammar unit as we move from nouns and types of sentences into adjectives and classification of adjectives. Students will be engaging in an adjective poem requiring the use of a thesaurus to look up as many high-powered adjectives as possible related to a topic of choice. In addition, levels of literature will be utilized in small group activities to ensure students can successfully identify adjectives and the nouns they are describing.

Handwriting: We will be completing reviewing all the letters of the alphabet this week as well as working on connecting some of our letters together to form small words!

Social Studies/Writing: We are finally heading into our first social studies unit which focuses on understanding geography (continents and oceans) as well as understanding where we live in relationship to the world. A small geography quiz will take place on Thursday of this week! A study guide will be sent home on Monday so that students can study what it is that will be tested. We are starting our first informational project of this year related to State and State Destinations. Students will be provided a list of states and destination to choose from and research. We will focus on how to research, how to take notes and how to write this information down in our own words. Students will be using and navigating various website as well as books to find their information.
