# This Week in Third Grade...





October 9-13

Math: This week, we will be officially ending our very first math unit that introduced the concepts behind division and multiplication. We will be reviewing tomorrow and the exam will take place on Tuesday! A study guide will be sent home tomorrow night that will model very closely what the test will look like on Tuesday. Starting on Wednesday, we will be starting a completely new unit. Module 2 is all about problem solving through measurement. This week, students will be focusing on telling time to the nearest minute as well as various elapsed time problems. Nevertheless, we will be continuing our timed multiplication tests

Reading: This week we will be completely reviewing all concepts learned throughout our first five weeks. Students will be reviewing plot structure, character traits and theme. In addition, we will review comparing and contrasting texts as well as cause and effect. Our mentor text this week will be a selection about Wilma Rudolph. In addition, students will be reading other pieces of literature within their guided reading groups.

Students will be comparing and contrasting "The Can Man" as well as "A Shelter in our Car." We will focus on creating characters, conducting a character analysis as well as analyzing theme!

Writing: We will be completing our very first journey through our narrative entitled "Our favorite memory." We will be focusing on adding "showing sentences" as well as dialogue to can end their narrative (reflection, lesson and setting.)

Handwriting: We will be focusing on reviewing letters t, s, i, u, l, f, r and c. In addition, students will be focusing on round tops "n and m.

Social Studies/ Science: We will continue with our life science unit as we review classification of organisms as well as animal life cycles. Students will also be working on their Beechwood Cube based off of our field trip last week!
