## This Week in Third Grade...



Math: On Monday of this week we will review the distributive property as well as number bonds and jump into the relationship between multiplication and division as students design their own multi-faceted word problems to think critically about this relationship. On Tuesday, students will focus on Division and the distributive property while on Wednesday and Thursday students will be exploring a variety of centers as well as math challenges as we dive head first into two and even three step word problems related to multiplication and division! Please continue to encourage your child to practice their multiplication facts nightly!

Reading: This week, students will be engaging in a variety of new vocabulary words as well as stories related to analyzing character, story structure as well as the importance of cause and effect within literature. We will be reading the story "Roberto Clemente

Pittsburgh Pride" as well as looking at the history behind the women'd baseball league "Mama Played Baseball." Later on this week we will be analyzing a few baseball poems as well as comparing and contrasting the lives of Roberto Clemente and Jackie Robinson, their triumphs and also challenges as individuals. Students will have the opportunity to choose their own book this week to explore related to our sports and overcoming diversity challenge with a journal entry due on Thursday of this week regarding their chosen story.

Grammar: Our Poem for this week as we celebrate "Peace Week" in preparation for International Peace Day is entitled "The Human Family" by Maya Angelou. We will read for fluency as well as meaning. We will continue the categorization of nouns (common, proper, singular, plural, gender specific) through poems and literary excerpts. Students will be engaging in a "October menu challenge" this week where they will be asked to design a "Fall-themed" menu item for a restaurant using as many nouns as possible and then categorizing those nouns using their own key. In addition, this week we are hopping into all the rules of plural nouns as well as singular and possessive nouns. Many hands-on activities are planned from "student-owned" plural noun collections to other possession suitcase games and challenges.

Writing/ Handwriting: Students will begin their third cursive writing lesson this week as review letters taught last week but also move into our "round top letters." In writing, students will explore the "orientation

beginnings" of six picture books as we look at how to write a good introduction to our narrative writing recount of our "Magical Moment" challenge. We will focus writing our Introduction Monday, our first main event Tuesday, and second and third events Wednesday and Thursday. This week, we are focusing on complete sentences and organization/sequencing of the story!

Science: This week we will continue our bean plant inquiry and review how plants react to light/heat/temperature. On Tuesday through the rest of the week, students will be engaging with animal groupings, invertebrates verses vertebrates and students will begin a mini research project on their choice of amphibian versus reptile project!
