
This Week in Third Grade...

Math: This week students will review the addition algorithm with four digit numbers (or greater.) In addition, we will review the subtraction algorithm and subtracting across zeros. Patterns regarding addition/subtraction as well as rounding and accuracy will be explored in addition to multi-step word problems and more rounding and place value warmups and activities to keep these concepts fresh in our minds. On Friday, we will most likely be reviewing the content learned throughout Module 2 and a test will take place next week (most likely Monday.)

Reading: Students really did a fabulous job thinking about Main Idea and corresponding details last week as we looked at the life of Mr. Heinz and learned a lot of Pittsburgh history. We will be reading one final chapter tomorrow before





what is considered our "review module for reading." Students will take a few comprehension tests scattered throughout the week." However, we will also conduct two separate guided reading groups during this time to break up the testing. One group will be exploring an extended fable entitled "Poppy" by Avi. A second group will be reading a fantastic extended fable entitled "Gooseberry Park." We will complete a lot of comprehension questions, writing and small group discussions in a more intimate setting which will be quite



lovely! Both are great novels, and I am looking forward to it!



Grammar: This week we will be moving into pronouns and reflexive pronouns. Students will identify pronouns and utilize pronouns through various poetry activities as well as independent and small group activities.

Writing/ Handwriting: Students will begin another cursive writing lesson this week as review letters taught last week but also move into our "round top letters." Our Creative Fiction Pieces are coming to an end. All students completed these pieces last week. We will be conducting a self-review rubric tomorrow regarding word choice,

officially begin a new Writing Unit which focuses on Compare and Contrast. We will be diving into the history of organization, paragraphing, dialogue and more. This week we will also "Thanksgiving" as we explore the "mainstream" version of Thanksgiving, cultural setting, native americans, pilgrims and the feast as well as the factual student friendly version of the account through National Geographic. Students will be analyzing primary resources, exploring paintings of "The First Thanksgiving" and looking at Thanksgiving through an historical lens!

Social Studies: Students completed their Pennsylvania Geography Projects as they explored natural resources, industry, wildlife, climate and more in the state of Pennsylvania. This week will be many mini

workshops regarding how to paraphrase effectively in regards to a research report as well as how to sort through information and pick out the most important information to include in a research report. Students will be utilizing a variety of books as well as culture grams to access information regarding the topics mentioned above!
